In this issue we present new research reports examining the pharmacognosy of several important medicinal plants including the antibacterial activity of *Cinnamomum oliveri* F.M.Bailey leaf extracts; the potential of *Aleurites moluccanus* (L.) Willd. nut extracts to prevent the autoimmune inflammatory diseases rheumatoid arthritis, ankylosing spondylitis and rheumatic fever; and the growth inhibitory activity of *Swainsonia formosa* (G.Don) Joy Thomp. leaf extracts against a panel of pathogenic bacteria.
